Host: It's a slam dunk for both parents and kids. Coming up next, we'll learn all about Healthy Hoops

Host: Well, it's a program that uses basketball as a way to educate kids and parents about ways to manage asthma. Here to tell me more about this unique opportunity welcome Coach Bobby Cremins and Terry Davenport from Select Health of South Carolina. Thank you for joining us.

Terry: Good morning, thank you for having us.

Host: And this is a really cool thing we're talking about. Tell us about Healthy Hoops and what it does?

Terry: Well, Healthy Hoops of SC was started by Select Health of SC back in 2005 and (unidentifiable) an education program that utilizes the sport of basketball to help parents and kids learn how to manage their asthma and also be very active. So we've been doing this since 2005 this is our fourth year actually in Charleston and Coach Cremins has been with us since the beginning.

Host: Yeah, Coach Cremins how did you get involved in this? Obviously basketball is a media tie-in, but how did you get involved?

Bobby : Well, their CEO and President, Mike Jernigan, he's a, he's a Clemson (unidentifiable) I am a Gamecock, but we became good friends and my dad had asthma. And I heard it would (unidentifiable) you know to show a kid who you know just because you have asthma, that doesn't mean you can not participate in sports and basketball being one sport. So I am looking forward to it. 9:00 AM, Burke High School, I'm going to bring some of our players with us and we're

going to have a clinic. But (unidentifiable) again, the biggest thing is just you know, if you have asthma you know don't use it as a handicap you can take part and participate.

Host: Yeah, 'cause Terry, you said that obesity sometimes goes hand-in-hand with asthma (unidentifiable). Tell us about that.

Terry: Absolutely because parents (unidentifiable) sometimes get nervous about their children participating in sports, because especially with asthma, because it you know involves breathing. Children become very sedentary and then you know there is the chance of obesity setting in so what we're also hoping to do, is to let kids know they can be active as long as their asthma is properly managed. It's a full day activity. Show up at 9 to do the registration. We're going to go through a very quick health screening. Then we're going to enter the court with Coach Cremins and other basketball legends to participate in a basketball camp.

Host: Sounds like a great time. And this is for children ages 7 through 15. And like we were talking before sometimes parents don't know their children may be asthmatic so even if they don't know (unidentifiable).

Terry: Absolutely. You can do onsite registration so if you're available Saturday, May 1<sup>st</sup> please come out to Burke High School. Registration will go from 9:00 AM to 10:30 AM. We will not be accepting children after 10:30 so that's very, very important this time around.

Bobby: And it's free.

Terry: And it's free, absolutely free. Thanks coach.

Host: Get your skills down with the (unidentifiable)

Bobby: We'll go through some drills and we're going to have a lot of fun.

Host: Alright. Sounds like a great fun time for a great cause. Thank you so much.
