Subject: Important Taxonomy code requirement on claim submissions

Summary: Beginning June 1, 2025, Select Health will require taxonomy codes on all claim submissions.

In order to comply with Federal Regulations, all providers and facilities providing services to Select Health members, must enroll with South Carolina Department of Health and Human Services (SCDHHS) for each specific NPI, Taxonomy, and location combination to continue serving beneficiaries. **Beginning June 1, 2025, Select Health will no longer accept claim submissions for providers who are not registered with SCDHHS.**

When submitting claims to Select Health, typical providers must use the NPI of the ordering/referring provider and the NPI and taxonomy code for each rendering pay-to and billing provider.
